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The Aizik Wolf fellowship awards a recent graduate of the College of the University of Chicago a one year stipend to work at a non-governmental organization, government agency, or international body dedicated to human rights.

Eligibility: Priority will be given to students who have previously completed a University of Chicago Human Rights Program internship and who propose returning to their previous organization or area of work. However, other College seniors with comparable experience are encouraged to apply. Applicants must have completed at least two Human Rights courses at the University of Chicago prior to their application. Only currently enrolled students in the College of the University of Chicago are eligible to apply.

Application Guidelines: All applications are due by 5:00 on or before Monday, March 10, 2007.

Applications should be submitted to the Human Rights Assistant to the Director in Pick 118.

1. Please submit the following:
 - a. This form, completed
 - b. Your resume
 - c. Essay responses (see below)
2. Please submit 3 letters of recommendation from faculty or previous supervisors or employers.
3. Letter of support from the proposed host organization.
Letters of recommendation may be submitted in a signed and sealed envelope with your application, or by e-mail to spmoberg@uchicago.edu (**Recommendation letters are due by Monday March 24, 2007**)

Essay Questions: Please answer each of the following questions in no more than 2 double-spaced pages per question, for a total of no more than 6 pages.

1. Please explain how you have demonstrated serious interest in human rights during your time in the College. You might include especially influential academic, work, volunteer, activist, or personal experiences that have inspired you to apply to this program.
2. Please describe how your experience as a Human Rights Intern (or other off campus human rights work) has impacted your education at Chicago.
3. Please describe to us the project you will engage in and the organization you will work for. How will this project advance your future career or activist goals?
